

Every boy or girl old enough to go to school and learn to read and write has already learned something about themselves. They have learned that they have a bad heart. They have found that it is often easier to do wrong than to do right. It seems that just what they have been told not to do, is what they want to do, and Oh how often they have disobeyed. God says all disobedience is sin, and sin brings us under the power of Satan who is called in the Bible, "the prince and power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience." – Ephesians 2:2

Satan's kingdom is called the kingdom of darkness, but God's kingdom is a Kingdom of light. That is why, when we do wrong things, our hearts feel heavy and sad, but when we do good things our hearts feel light and glad.
